
THE THREE RIVERS DISTRICT COUNCIL (CROXLEY GREEN) PARKING PLACES AND WAITING RESTRICTIONS ORDER 2020

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Three Rivers District Council, acting as agent for the Hertfordshire County Council and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police has made the above named Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Full details are set out in the Order which, together with plans and a statement of reasons for making the Orders, can be viewed on the Council website at www.threerivers.gov.uk/parkingnotices. For general enquiries about this order, please contact Regulatory Services by email at parking@threerivers.gov.uk or by telephone on 01923 776611, quoting the reference "15-4". Documents are also placed on deposit at the Council offices in Rickmansworth, but as the public cannot currently view these in person, copies may be requested by email.

The effects of this order will be to introduce a controlled parking zone operating from 12pm to 1pm Monday to Friday, including waiting restrictions and permit parking places to prioritise parking for people living locally, and to improve safety and traffic flow, in the following roads:

This order designates permit parking places (as shown in the plans) for vehicles with a permit from 12pm to 1pm Monday to Friday except Bank Holidays, which are passenger vehicles, goods vehicles (the overall height of which does not exceed 2.3 metres and the overall length of which does not exceed 5.25 metres), and motor cycles. This Order will come into effect on the 20 February 2021 and **the Permit Zone is planned to start operating from the 31 March 2021, subject to any changes in national guidance and legislation.**

Permit charges will be:

Resident annual permits: First permit £30.00, Second permit £55.00

Visitor vouchers: £6.00 for ten one-day residents' visitor's permits

All other permits at the standard charge (Doctor & Health visitor permits, Special permits)

Any person wishing to question the validity of this order or any provision contained within it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to that order, may apply to the High Court for this purpose within six weeks of the date on which the order was made (6 January 2021).

Statement of Reasons for making

THE THREE RIVERS DISTRICT COUNCIL (CROXLEY GREEN) PARKING PLACES AND WAITING RESTRICTIONS ORDER 2020

Three Rivers District Council (pursuant to arrangements made with Hertfordshire County Council) intends to introduce a Controlled Parking Zone in Croxley Green, Rickmansworth.

It is planned that these measures will:

- Prioritise parking for people who need it most, primarily for access to local addresses
- Promote safe, lawful and less obstructive parking practices, to improve the safety and accessibility of local roads
- Improve the experience of people travelling locally, whether walking, cycling or driving, by providing more space to manoeuvre and better visibility at road junctions
- Improve local visual amenity by reducing disorganised parking and sign clutter

The scheme was developed following consultation with residents, District and County Councillors, Hertfordshire County Council, Hertfordshire Constabulary and all other statutory consultees, taking into account Section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

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PART I - PRELIMINARY

Three Rivers District Council pursuant to arrangements made with Hertfordshire County Council under section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000 and the Local Authorities (Arrangements for Discharge of Functions) (England) Regulations 2000 in exercise of the powers conferred on the said County Council under sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 32, 35, 45, 46, 47, 49, 53 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said 1984 Act makes the following Order:-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as *The Three Rivers (Croxley Green, On-Street Parking Places and Waiting Restrictions) Order 2020* and shall come into force on 20 February 2021.

Interpretation

2. (1) In this Order, except where the context otherwise required, the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them:

"All zones exemption" means an exemption granted by the Council at its discretion for the leaving of certain specified vehicles in parking places as are being used by Council staff, contractors, or other public bodies carrying out duties for which the use of the specified parking places is essential in the course of performing their duties, as may from time to time be authorised by the Council;

"Civil enforcement officer" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place or loading place and to enforce the provisions of this Order;

"Council" means Three Rivers District Council and includes any parking services contractors or authorised agent appointed by and acting on behalf of the Council for the purposes of any function under the provisions of this Order;

"Designated officer" means an officer of Three Rivers District Council nominated by the Head of Regulatory Services or equivalent to carry out Council functions associated with the provisions of this Order;

"Disabled person's badge" and "disabled person's vehicle" have the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"Doctor and Health Visitor permit", hereafter referred to as a "DHV permit", means a permit granted or issued under the provisions of Article 33;

"DHV permit holder" means an organisation to whom a DHV permit has been issued or granted under the provisions of Article 33;

"Driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place or restricted street, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place or restricted street, as the case may be;

"Electronic communications network" has the same meaning as in the Communications Act 2003;

"Electronic permits system" means a computerised system operated by or on the behalf of the Council or its authorised agent which facilitates and records details pertaining to parking permits and which can transmit data to and receive data from hand-held devices;

"Electronic payment system" means an computerised system operated by or on the behalf of the Council or its authorised agent whereby the driver of a vehicle, or some other person authorised by that driver on their behalf, uses an electronic device to make payment of the parking charge in respect of a specified vehicle, a specified parking place and for a specified parking period by use of a debit or credit card and which records details pertaining to such payment, vehicle, parking place and parking period;

"Enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

"Goods" means goods of any kind whether animate or inanimate (except human passengers) and includes postal packets of any description; and "delivering" and "collecting" in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

"Goods vehicle" has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016;

"Hand-held device", means an portable computing device which can transmit data to and receive data from the electronic permits system and electronic payments system for the purposes of verifying if valid permits have been granted or issued or payment of the parking charge has been

made in respect of vehicles waiting in any parking place specified in the map-based schedule;

"Household" means a dwelling with a separate entry on the Council's Council Tax register;

"Loading place" means an area on a highway authorised as a loading place by this Order, being identified as such on the map tile relating to that loading place, by reference to the map schedule legend or the tile label, or both;

"Operational vehicle" means a vehicle operated by the entitled business user for the purposes of making deliveries, collections, servicing or such other business purposes as the Council shall approve;

"Owner", in relation to a vehicle, means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used;

"Map based schedule" means a collection of map tiles attached to this Order and listed in Schedule 1 which depict the parking places, loading places or waiting, loading or stopping restrictions designated, authorised or imposed, as the case may be, by this Order and, in conjunction with the map schedule legend or the tile label, or both, identifies the type of each particular parking place, loading place or length of waiting, loading or stopping restrictions and, if appropriate, certain of their governing provisions:

Provided that the Council does not accept responsibility for any inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon to create the map based schedule and where a parking place, loading place or length of waiting, loading or stopping restrictions is depicted on the map based schedule, that parking place, loading place or length of waiting, loading or stopping restrictions will continue to apply irrespective of any subsequent changes that have been made to the underlying Ordnance Survey data;

"Map schedule legend" means the map schedule legend attached to this Order which, when used in conjunction with a map tile, identifies the specific type of parking places, loading places or waiting, loading or stopping restrictions designated, authorised or imposed, as the case may be, by this Order and, where appropriate, certain of their governing provisions;

"Map tile" means an individual map with a specific tile reference, being part of the map based schedule attached to this Order;

"Maximum stay period", in relation to a pay and display parking place, a limited waiting time parking place, a shared-use residents' permit holders and limited waiting time parking place, a shared-use residents' permit holders and limited waiting time parking place, or a loading place, means the maximum period of time a vehicle may be left in or may wait in that parking place or loading place, as the case may be, specified in relation to each parking place or loading place by way of the map schedule legend or a tile label, or both,

"Minimum return interval", in relation to a pay and display parking place, a limited waiting time parking place, a shared-use residents' permit holders and limited waiting time parking place, a shared-use residents' permit holders and limited waiting time parking place, or a loading place, means the minimum period of time before a vehicle, having been taken away from a parking place or loading place, may again be left in or may wait in that

same parking place or loading place, as the case may be, specified in relation to each parking place or loading place by way of the map schedule legend or a tile label, or both;

"No stopping hours", in relation to a restricted street, school keep clear marking or taxi rank, being the hours during which a vehicle may not stop whilst complying with the relevant provisions of this Order, means the time indicated by means of the map schedule legend or the tile label, or both, in respect of that restricted street, school keep clear marking or taxi rank, as the case may be;

"Parking period" means a period of time either:-

- (a) for which payment of the parking charge has been made in respect of a vehicle and during which, subject to the provisions of this Order, that vehicle may be left in a pay and display parking place; or
- (b) during which, subject to the provisions of this Order, that vehicle may be left in a limited waiting time parking place, a shared-use residents' permit holders and limited waiting time parking place, or a shared-use residents' permit holders

and limited waiting time parking place;

"parking place" means an area on a highway either:-

- (a) designated as a parking place by this Order, being either a resident permit holder only parking place, a resident permit holders parking area, a pay and display parking place, a resident permit and disabled badge holders parking place, a shared-use resident permit holders and limited waiting time parking place; or
- (b) authorised as a parking place by this Order, being either a limited waiting time parking place, or a disabled badge holders parking place;

and in each case being identified as such type on the map tile relating to that parking place, by reference to the map schedule legend or the tile label, or both;

"Parking ticket" means a ticket issued by a ticket machine as indication of payment of the parking charge in respect of a pay and display parking place;

"Parking zone" means an area identified in **column 1 of Schedule 2** as a parking zone comprising the streets listed in **column 2 of Schedule 2**;

"Passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor-cycle) constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than- twelve passengers (exclusive of the driver) and their effects and not drawing a trailer;

"Permitted hours", in relation to a parking place or loading place, means the time during which a vehicle may wait in a parking place or loading place whilst complying with the relevant provisions of this Order, means such period referred to by way of the map schedule legend or the tile label, or both, in relation to that parking place or loading place;

"Prescribed hours", in relation to a restricted street or taxi rank, being the hours during which a vehicle may not wait whilst complying with the relevant provisions of this Order, means the time indicated by means of the map schedule legend or the tile label, or both, in relation to that restricted street or taxi rank, as the case may be.

"Resident" means a person whose usual place of abode is at premises the postal address of which is in any street or part of any street described in **Schedule 2**;

"Residents' permit" means a permit issued or granted under the provisions of Article 18;

"Residents' permit holder" means a person to whom a permit has been issued or granted under the provisions of Article 18;

"Residents' visitor's permit" means a permit issued or granted under the provisions of Article 18;

"Residents' visitor's permit holder" means a person to whom a visitor's permit has been issued or granted under the provisions of Article 18;

"Restricted hours", in relation to any restricted street, being the hours during which a vehicle may not wait for the purpose of loading or unloading that vehicle whilst complying with the relevant provisions of this Order, means the time indicated by means of the map schedule legend or the tile label, or both, in relation to that restricted street;

"Restricted street" means any street or part of a street within the Three Rivers District identified by way of the map schedule legend or the tile label, or both, as having prescribed hours, restricted hours or no stopping hours applying to that street or length of street;

Provided that the expression "restricted street" shall not for the purpose of this Order include any area on a highway which is shown on a map tile designated or authorised as a parking place or loading place under the provisions of **Part II** of this Order.

"School keep clear marking" means a length of street on the highway, shown on the map schedule and identified as such on the map schedule legend or the tile label, or both;

"Special parking permit" means a permit issued or granted under the provisions of Articles 32 and 33;

"Special parking permit holder" means a person to whom a permit has been issued or granted under the provisions of Articles 32 and 33;

"Street" includes any part of a street;

- (2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- (3) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.

- (4) For the purposes of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position when it is so regarded for the purposes of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.
- (5) For the purposes of this Order a vehicle shall be deemed to wait:
 - (a) in a parking place, loading place or restricted street if any point in that street is below the vehicle or its load (if any) and the vehicle is stationary; or
 - (b) for more than a specified period in the same place in a parking place, loading place or restricted street if any one point in that street is below the vehicle or its load (if any) throughout a period exceeding the specified period whether or not the vehicle is moved during that period.
- (6) Any reference in this Order to a length of restricted street shall, unless otherwise specified, be construed as a reference to the whole width of that length of street.
- (7) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- (8) The restrictions, prohibitions and requirements imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption from the provisions of this Order is without prejudice to the provisions of any other enactment.

PART II - DESIGNATION OR AUTHORISATION, AND USE OF PARKING PLACES

Designation or authorisation of parking places

3. (1) Each area on a highway comprising a length of carriageway of a street identified in the map based schedule and by way of the map schedule legend or a tile label, or both, as either a resident permit holder only parking place, a pay and display parking place, a resident permit and disabled badge holders parking place, a shared-use resident permit holders and limited waiting time parking place, as the case may be, which, unless otherwise so specified, shall be bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 1.8 metres, is hereby designated as a parking place.
- (2) Each area on a highway comprising a part or parts of the carriageway of a street identified in the map based schedule and by way of the map schedule legend or a tile label, or both, as a resident permit holders parking area parking place, excluding any part of that area being a restricted street, during the prescribed hours, or restricted hours, or no stopping hours, as the case may be, in relation to that restricted street or which is authorised as a parking place other or a loading place under the provisions of this Order, is hereby designated as a parking place.
- (3) Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street identified in the map based schedule and by way of the map schedule legend or a tile label, or both, as either a limited waiting time parking place, or a disabled badge holders parking place, as the case may be, which, unless otherwise so specified, shall be bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 1.8 metres, is hereby authorised as a parking place.

Vehicles for which parking places are designated or authorised

4. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Order, parking places may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of vehicles of the following class, that is: passenger vehicles, goods vehicles (the overall height of which does not exceed 2.3 metres and the overall length of which does not exceed 5.25 metres), and motor cycles.
- (2) Resident permit holder only parking places may be used for the leaving during permitted hours of such vehicles of the class specified in Article 4(1) above:-
 - (a) in respect of which vehicle there has been issued or granted a residents' permit valid for the parking zone within which that vehicle is left; or
 - (b) in respect of which vehicle there has been issued or granted a residents' visitor's permit valid for the parking zone within which that vehicle is left, or as display in the manner specified in Article 5(1) a residents' visitor's permit valid for the parking zone within which that vehicle is left; or

- (c) in respect of which vehicle there has been issued or granted a valid special parking permit or a valid DHV permit.
- (3) Resident permit holders parking area parking places may be used for the leaving during permitted hours of such vehicles of the class specified in Article 4(1) above:-
 - (a) in respect of which vehicle there has been issued or granted a residents' permit valid for the parking zone within which that vehicle is left; or
 - (b) in respect of which vehicle there has been issued or granted a residents' visitor's permit valid for the parking zone within which that vehicle is left, or as display in the manner specified in Article 5(1) a residents' visitor's permit valid for the parking zone within which that vehicle is left; or
 - (c) in respect of which vehicle there has been issued or granted a valid special parking permit or a valid DHV permit.
- (4) Limited waiting time parking places may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles of the class specified in Article 4(1) above for no longer than the maximum stay period specified in relation to each parking place, provided that no vehicle may return to a parking place within the minimum return interval specified in relation to that parking place.
- (5) Pay and display parking places may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles of the class specified in Article 4(1) above as either:-
 - (a) display in the manner specified in Article 5(2) a valid parking ticket; or
 - (b) in respect of which payment of the parking charge by way of the electronic payments system.

Provided that:-

- (i) no vehicle shall be left in a pay and display parking place:
 - (A) for longer than the parking period in respect of which payment of the parking charge has been made; or
 - (B) where a maximum stay period is specified in relation to that parking place, for longer than that maximum stay period; or
 - (C) where no maximum stay period is specified in relation to that parking place, for a period of longer than 24 hours;
 - and
 - (ii) where a minimum return interval is specified in relation to a pay and display parking place, no vehicle may return to that parking place within that minimum return interval.
- (6) Disabled badge holders parking places may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles of the class specified in Article 4(1) as

display in the manner specified in Article 2(4) a valid disabled person's badge.

- (7) Resident permit and disabled badge holders parking places may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles of the class specified in Article 4(1) as both:
 - (a) display in the manner specified in Article 2(4) a valid disabled person's badge; and
 - (b) in respect of which vehicle there has been issued or granted a residents' permit valid for the parking zone within which that vehicle is left.
- (8) Shared use resident permit holders and limited waiting time parking places may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles of the class specified in Article 4(1), either:
 - (a) for no longer than the maximum stay period specified in relation to each parking place, provided that no vehicle may return to a parking place within the minimum return interval specified in relation to that parking place; or
 - (b) in respect of which vehicle there has been issued or granted a residents' permit valid for the parking zone within which that vehicle is left; or
 - (c) in respect of which vehicle there has been issued or granted a residents' visitor's permit valid for the parking zone within which that vehicle is left, or as display in the manner specified in Article 5(1) a residents' visitor's permit valid for the parking zone within which that vehicle is left; or
 - (d) in respect of which vehicle there has been issued or granted a valid special parking permit or a valid DHV permit.
- (9) Other than in accordance with the provisions of this Order, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be left in or wait in a parking place.

Tickets or permits to be displayed on or indications by hand-held device in respect of vehicles left in parking places

5. (1) At all times during which a vehicle is left in a resident permit holders only parking place or a resident permit holders parking area parking place during the permitted hours, either: the driver shall cause to be displayed in the relevant position a valid residents' permit, a valid residents' visitor's permit or a valid special parking permit or a valid DHV permit issued in respect of that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order so that all the particulars on that permit are readily visible from the outside, or there shall be an indication by hand-held device that a valid residents' permit, a valid residents' visitor's permit or a valid special parking permit or a valid DHV permit has been granted in respect of that vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

- (2) At all times during which a vehicle is left in a pay and display parking place during the permitted hours, either: the driver shall cause to be displayed in the relevant position a valid ticket issued in respect of that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order so that all the particulars on that ticket are readily visible from the outside of that vehicle, or there shall be an indication by hand-held device that payment of the parking charge has been made in respect of the vehicle using the electronic payment system, in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
- (3) At all times during which a vehicle is left in a disabled badge holders parking place during the permitted hours, the driver shall cause to be displayed in the relevant position a valid disabled person's badge.
- (4) At all times during which a vehicle is left in a resident permit and disabled badge holders parking place during the permitted hours, the driver shall:
 - (a) either: cause to be displayed in the relevant position a valid residents' permit issued in respect of that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order so that all the particulars on that permit are readily visible from the outside of that vehicle, or there shall be an indication by hand-held device that a valid residents' permit has been granted in respect of that vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of this Order;and
 - (b) cause to be displayed in the relevant position a valid disabled person's badge.
- (5) At all times during which a vehicle is left in a shared-use resident permit holders and limited waiting time parking place during the permitted hours for a period of time longer than the maximum stay period specified in relation to the use of that parking place as a limited waiting time parking place as either: the driver shall cause to be displayed in the relevant position either: the driver shall cause to be displayed in the relevant position a valid residents' permit, a valid residents' visitor's permit or a valid special parking permit or a valid DHV permit issued in respect of that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order so that all the particulars on that permit are readily visible from the outside, or there shall be an indication by hand-held device that a valid residents' permit, a valid residents' visitor's permit or a valid special parking permit or a valid DHV permit has been granted in respect of that vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

Contravention of this Order in relation to parking places

6. If a vehicle is left or is waiting in a parking place during the permitted hours without complying with the provisions of this Order, then a contravention of, or failure to comply with this Order shall be deemed to have occurred.

Alteration of position of a vehicle in a parking place

7. Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 10, a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions.

Movement of a vehicle in a parking place in an emergency

8. A police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may, in case of emergency, move or cause to be moved to any place they think fit, any vehicle left in a parking place.

Exemptions for certain vehicles

9. (1) A disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge may be left in a pay and display parking place without time limit, provided that the use of that parking place in which the vehicle is left has not been suspended, and no parking charge shall be incurred or payable in respect of that vehicle.
- (2) Where this Order prescribes a maximum stay period or, where applicable, a maximum stay period and minimum return interval, in relation to a parking place, those time periods shall not apply to any disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge.
- (3) A motor cycle may be left in a pay and display parking place without time limit, provided that the use of that parking place in which the vehicle is left has not been suspended, and no parking charge shall be incurred or payable in respect of that vehicle.
- (4) A vehicle in respect of which has been granted an all zones exemption duly authorised by the Council, may be left in any parking place without time limit, provided that the vehicle is being used in the course of the carrying out of such duties in respect of which said all zones exemption has been granted, and that the use of that parking place in which the vehicle is left has not been suspended, and no parking charge shall be incurred or payable in respect of that vehicle.
- (5) Without prejudice to the generality of this Article, and notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, a disabled person's vehicle or motor cycle or vehicle in respect of which has been granted an all zones exemption shall stand in a parking place in accordance with the provisions of Article 10.

PART III - SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS RELATING TO PARKING PLACES

Section 1 - General

Manner of standing in a parking place

10. Every vehicle left in a parking place in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall so stand:
 - (a) in the case of a parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place is identified on the highway by means of appropriate road markings or the placing of an appropriate sign nearby, or both, as to be in accordance with that identification or sign, or both;
 - (b) in the case of any other parking place, so that:
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle other than a motor cycle, the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle; or
 - (ii) in the case of a motor cycle, the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is perpendicular to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle;and the wheels of the vehicle are not more than 300 millimetres away from the edge of the carriageway nearest the vehicle; and
 - (c) that every part of a vehicle is within the limits of a parking place.

Power to suspend the use of a parking place

11. (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council or the Police may suspend the use of a parking place, or any part thereof, whenever they consider such suspension reasonably necessary:
 - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety; or
 - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation adjacent to the parking place, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the parking place, the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any electronic communications network or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign; or
 - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the parking place from or to a depository, another office or dwelling-house; or
 - (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
 - (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions.

- (2) A police constable in uniform may suspend for not longer than twenty-four hours the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever they consider such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
- (3) Any person or police constable suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) or, as the case may be, paragraph (2) of this Article shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or part thereof a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
- (4) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be waiting at a parking place or any part thereof during which such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or part thereof a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) above provided that nothing in this paragraph shall apply –
 - (a) in respect to any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 13(1) (b), (d) or (e); or
 - (b) to anything done with permission of the person suspending the use of the parking place or part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article or a police constable in uniform.

Restriction on the use of a parking place

12. During the permitted hours no person shall use any parking place or any vehicle while it is in a parking place in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of any goods to any person in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of their skill in handicraft or their services in any other capacity:

Provided that nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle:

- (1) if the vehicle is a passenger vehicle, a goods vehicle, or a motor cycle and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected; or
- (2) if the vehicle is one to which the provisions of Article 13(1)(h) apply.

Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in a parking place

- 13 (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours in any part of a parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:
- (a) the vehicle is waiting for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling any person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom their personal luggage;
 - (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond their control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
 - (c) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or, not being a passenger vehicle, is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting;
 - (d) the vehicle is waiting for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (e) the vehicle is waiting:
 - (i) while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the parking place or loading place in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle or, having been unloaded therefrom, are being delivered; or
 - (ii) while postal packets are being collected for the loading on the vehicle from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the parking place or loading place in which the vehicle is waiting or, having been so collected, are being unloaded thereon;
 - (f) the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle is waiting only for as long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for the purpose specified in Article 11(1)(b),
 - (g) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from an office or a dwelling-house adjacent to the parking place from or to a depository, another office or dwelling-house;
 - (h) in any other case the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and the vehicle does not wait for a period exceeding twenty minutes or for such longer period as a civil enforcement officer may approve.
- (2) No parking charge shall be payable in respect of any vehicle waiting in a parking place in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Article.
- (3) Except as provided by this Order, the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a parking place during the permitted hours.

- (4) The driver of a vehicle waiting in a parking place by virtue of the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article shall cause it so to stand in accordance with the provisions of Article 10.
- (5) Nothing in the provisions of this Order shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any regulations made or having effect as if made under section 25 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Section 2 - The parking charge and indications by parking ticket, ticket machine and the electronic payment system

Amount of the parking charge and maximum stay periods

14. (1) The parking charge for a vehicle (other than a vehicle otherwise exempted by this Order) left in a long-stay pay and display parking place during the permitted hours shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be as specified in **item 1(a) of Schedule 3**. The parking charge for a vehicle (other than a vehicle otherwise exempted by this Order) left in a short-stay pay and display parking place during the permitted hours shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be as specified in **item 1(b) of Schedule 3**.
- (2) Where payment of the parking charge has been made in respect of a vehicle left in a pay and display parking place, the parking period shall not exceed the maximum stay period specified in relation to that parking place.

Payment of the parking charge

15. (1) Payment of the parking charge shall be made, in accordance with the next following paragraph, immediately after a vehicle is left in a pay and display parking place.
- (2) The parking charge shall be payable on the leaving of a vehicle in a pay and display parking place either:-
 - (a) by the insertion of coins of an appropriate denomination together making up the amount of the parking charge for the parking period for which payment is being made in a ticket machine relating to that parking place, following which the driver shall display or cause to be displayed on that vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (3) below, the parking ticket issued; or
 - (b) where a ticket machine situated in the parking place in which the vehicle is left accepts a credit card or a debit card, by the insertion in that ticket machine of a valid credit card or debit card (which shall be debited with the amount of the parking charge for the parking period for which payment is being made), following which the driver shall display or cause to be displayed on that vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (3) below, the parking ticket issued; or
 - (c) using the electronic payment system;

and by following the instructions for payment of the parking charge as indicated on that ticket machine or, as the case may be on a sign relating to that parking place.

Provided that, where only one of the methods of payment referred to in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) above is available, that method shall be used for payment of the parking charge.

- (3) The parking ticket referred to in the last preceding paragraph shall be displayed on the vehicle in respect of which it was issued at all times during which the vehicle is left in a pay and display parking place during the permitted hours, so that all the particulars on that side of the parking ticket which bears the indication that a parking charge has been paid and the day
